


# Mother Mary

St. Patrick

St. Patrick was born in Britain at the end of the fourth century to wealthy parents. When he was 16 years old, Irish raiders attacked his family estate, captured the teenage Patrick, and transported him to Ireland. Like any person taken away from a loving family, Patrick was lonely and afraid. It is at this point in his life that he turned to God for comfort and guidance, becoming a devout Christian, later deciding to return to Ireland to convert the pagan Irish. He was not the first missionary to go to Ireland, but the others before him had not been of Irish descent and so had little success. Patrick was made a bishop and along with two deacons, arrived in Wicklow in 432 A.D. From then on he covered the length and breadth of Ireland spreading the word of Christ.

After years of selfless service, he left for his eternal reward on 17th March, 461. He was later elevated to sainthood as St. Patrick and is the Patron Saint of the Congregation of the Brothers of St. Patrick or the Patrician Brothers as they are popularly known. The Shamrock, a member of the clover family, became a Patrician symbol. It was used by St. Patrick to explain the mystery of the Trinity, its three leaves representing the Trinity (The Father, the Son & the Holy Spirit).

The life of St. Patrick and his prayer "The Breastplate of St. Patrick" continue to inspire the Brothers who strive to see Christ in the people to whom they have committed their lives in serving.

School week celebration 2020



ristotle once said, "Man is a social animal", this means that humans are expected to live in groups from the moment they are born. These various groups and forms of social living play a vital role in their lives and affect their mental health in various ways, positively or negatively. Group cohesiveness has an important influence on one's mind and behaviour and when this component of life is hampered, it can invoke high levels of stress in him/her.

When the world was hit by a life-changing pandemic, governments around the globe took drastic measures to control the spread of the coronavirus and safeguard its citizens. Lockdowns, strict isolation and quarantine were some of the many changes which were introduced. People were confined to their homes for multiple weeks which led to intense mental stress. Everyone's day-to-day activities were disturbed and the resulting economic recession has negatively affected many people's mental health. Various psychological problems emerged as people were forced to reduce social contact and activities. In a recent survey conducted by the Indian Psychiatry Society, there seems to be a sudden rise in those suffering from mental illness which has reached up to 20 per cent. According to this survey, at least one out of every five Indians is suffering from mental illness.

Progress in mental health services has been quite slow in most low and middle-income countries. Certain barriers including the existing public-health priorities and funding, the low numbers of those trained in mental health care, the lack of public knowledge etc. pose a challenge to the mental health care delivery system.

In such challenging times, mental health awareness can play a crucial role. Simple behavioural changes and mindfulness can make a significant impact towards positive mental health. Mental health awareness campaigns have yielded positive outcomes. Some of the strategies undertaken to target awareness and address the stigma around mental illness include participation by family members, sensitization to treatment and social inclusion. Digital mental health care services such as online treatment, assessment and counselling are ways through which people can be helped and provided support from the comfort of their own home, which is beneficial for them in such grave times. With rising awareness, it can be expected that early recognition and access to treatment will follow, as will the adoption of preventive measures and government funding.

Thus, we now have a new opportunity to explore the paradigm of mental health awareness as a means of combating stigma, enhancing prevention, ensuring early recognition, and also stimulating simple and practical interventions within the community.



### "The fun we had"



n the wake of the covid-19 pandemic, schools have been shut all across the world. Globally, over 1.6 billion children in 195 countries are out of their classrooms.

The closing of schools did not stop education.

Online education comes in shades of grey. There have been successful transitions among the educational institutions to adopt the online platform of learning. The COVID-19 pandemic has defeated the centuries-old tradition that students traveled to a physical institution to learn. Now, in many places, school and university classrooms are on laptops and smartphone screens, and the Internet has replaced physical books. A survey conducted by UNESCO revealed that the use of digital content in education was only 0-20% before the pandemic which has culminated into a boom of 60% during the pandemic.

The pandemic has disrupted OUR education system that, many assert, was already losing its relevance. In his book 21 lessons for the 21st century, scholar Yuval Noah Harari outlines how schools continue to focus on traditional academic skills and rote learning, rather than on skills such as critical thinking and adaptability, which will be more important for success in the future. Hence the present scenario is a catalyst to create the new education system.

A landmark achievement in this direction is the launching of the PM e-VIDYA Platform, with 12 new DTH channels, one for each class to reach out to all stratas of societies.

Some researches show that on an average students retain 25 to 60% more material when learning online compared to only 8-10% in a classroom. E-learning requires 40 to 60% less time to learn than in a traditional classroom setting.

The shift from notebook to laptop, not only replicates physical classes or lecture through video capabilities, but also uses a range of collaboration tools and engagement methods that promote inclusion, personalization and intelligence. Studies have also shown that children extensively use their senses for effective and permanent learning.

A lot of issues are attached to online education but we cannot ignore the perks of it in times of such crisis. We can always have solutions by fixing the glitches. I here by reiterate that moving towards laptops and mobile screens for learning is no more an option it is a necessity.
