St. Patrick

St. Patrick was born in Britain at the end of the fourth century to wealthy parents. When he was 16 years old, Irish raiders attacked his family estate, captured the teenage Patrick, and transported him to Ireland. Like any person taken away from a loving family, Patrick was lonely and afraid. It is at this point in his life that he turned to God for comfort and guidance, becoming a devout Christian, later deciding to return to Ireland to convert the pagan Irish. He was not the first missionary to go to Ireland, but the others before him had not been of Irish descent and so had little success. Patrick was made a bishop and along with two deacons, arrived in Wicklow in 432 A.D. From then on he covered the length and breadth of Ireland spreading the word of Christ.

After years of selfless service he left for his eternal reward on 17th March, 461. He was later elevated to sainthood as St. Patrick and is the Patron Saint of the Congregation of the Brothers of St. Patrick or the Patrician Brothers as they are popularly known. The Shamrock, a member of the clover family, became a Patrician symbol. It was used by St. Patrick to explain the mystery of the Trinity, its three leaves representing the Trinity (The Father, the Son & the Holy Spirit).

The life of St. Patrick and his prayer "The Breastplate of St. Patrick" continue to inspire the Brothers who strive to see Christ in the people to whom they have committed their lives in serving.

SENIOR SCHOOL COORDINATOR'S MESSAGE

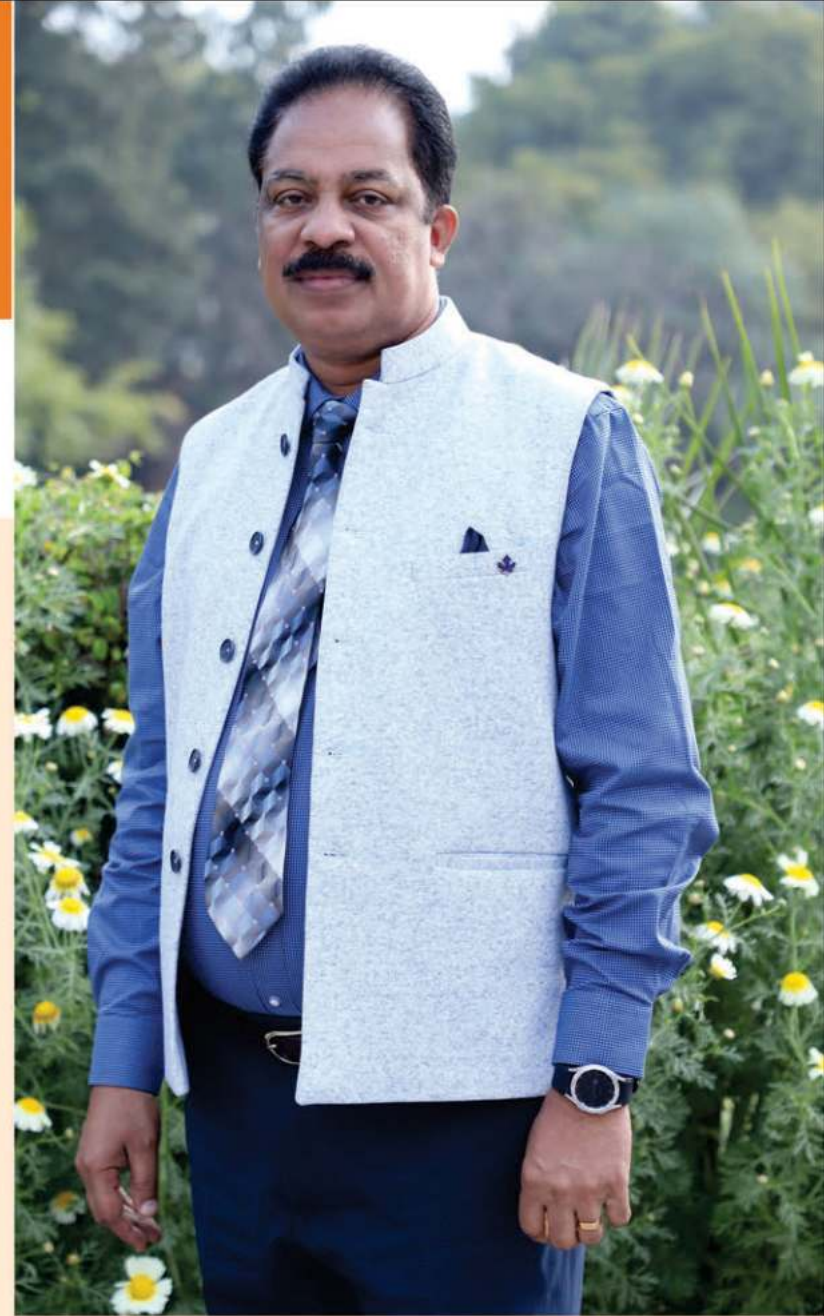

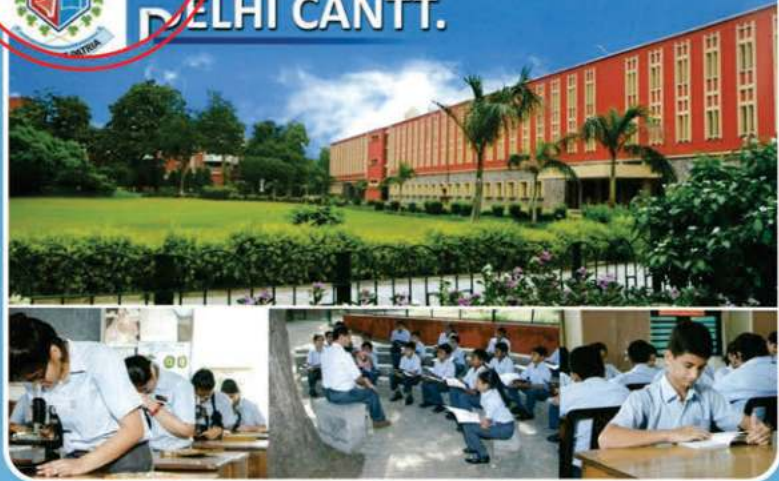

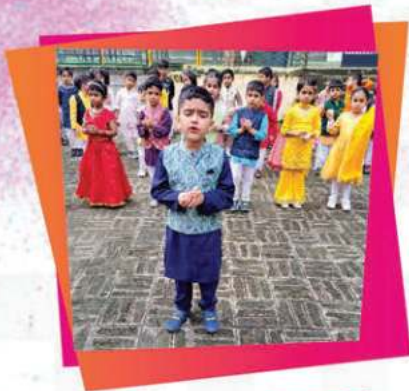


Orientation Prep

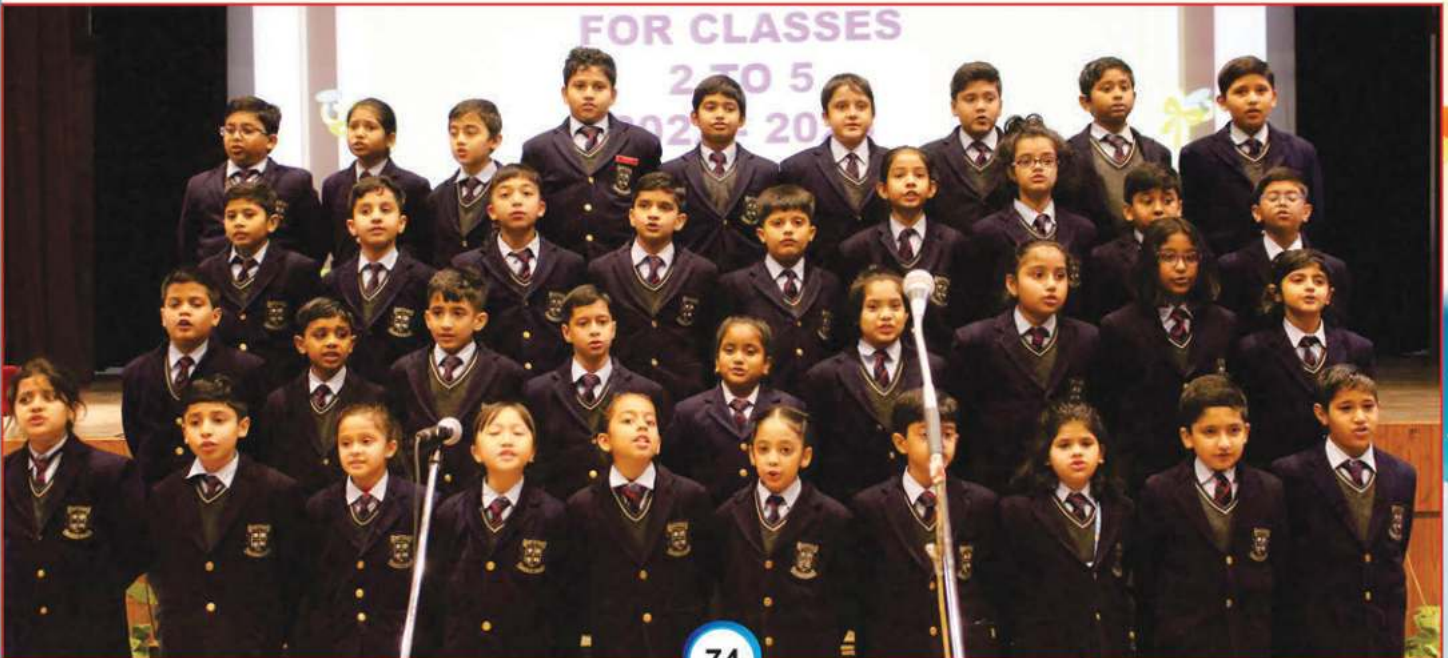


English and Hindi Choral Recitation Competition 2022-23 Classes 2 to 5

Personal Contact classes are conducted with the help of teachers of MSM in the afternoon for the children who are allotted to our study centre. The teachers are also part of the Practical

&Public Examination which is held twice a year in the months of April- May and October- November for the benefit of these learners.

Over the years, MSM has been instrumental in helping thousands of students achieve their dreams through the NIOS. NIOS-MSM is grateful to the teachers and all the other staff members for their untiring support and guidance given all through. Principal Rev. Bro. Tomy Varghese is the NIOS Coordinator and Mr Devesh Kumar is the NIOS Asst. Coordinator at Mount St. Mary's School.

Marian Support for the people of Turkey & Syria

As we all know, Turkey and Syria faced significant challenges due to massive earthquakes.

The Action Committee of unaided recognised Private schools had requested for help.

The MSM family, with Bro. Tomy Varghese at the helm worked towards garnering help for them.

MSM Action Plan:

Brother envisioned a student initiative and the Student Council of Class XI led by Mohal and Chinmayee Khanna respectively, were put in charge.

Brother had a three-pronged agenda for them, as follows:

1. To sensitise the Council who in turn would sensitise all the students about the challenges being faced by the earthquake victims.
2. Personal connect – The Council members went to each class and explained about the woeful situation in Turkey and Syria. They went prepared with a Power Point Presentations and material to appeal to students of all age groups. They used role plays, enactments of piles of books falling etc. to explain to the Junior School kids. It was a great learning



experience for the Council members. They realised and learnt how one method cannot be used for all to establish connect.

3. Collection/ Donation: The embassies of Turkey and Syria had shared a list of essential items which were then collected. Children displayed their empathy and compassion by donating generously.

Many believed that a circular might have been more effective but the value of life skills learnt by the student fraternity, as they helped out with this initiative, cannot be quantified. It was heart-warming to see that kids gave 20, 50 rupees from their pocket money!

Life Skills Learnt

- Organisation of the whole process, consisting of planning and implementation of the drive.
- Division of work and monitoring of the process for smooth implementation of plan and thereafter needed amendments, if required.
- Collection of the items brought by all students - clothes, medicines, toiletries and money (almost Rs. 25000).
- Segregation and discarding of items that were old, worn out or expired and of no use to the earthquake victims. In this process the volunteers also found an NGO that recycles the clothes to make coats for stray dogs.
- Packing of material is also a skill that is essential. The packing was also done by the student volunteers.

Overall, it was indeed a great learning experience for all! After all, MSM believes in educating the youngsters, not just making them literate, but giving them opportunities to use their skills, develop into leaders of stature as they grow.

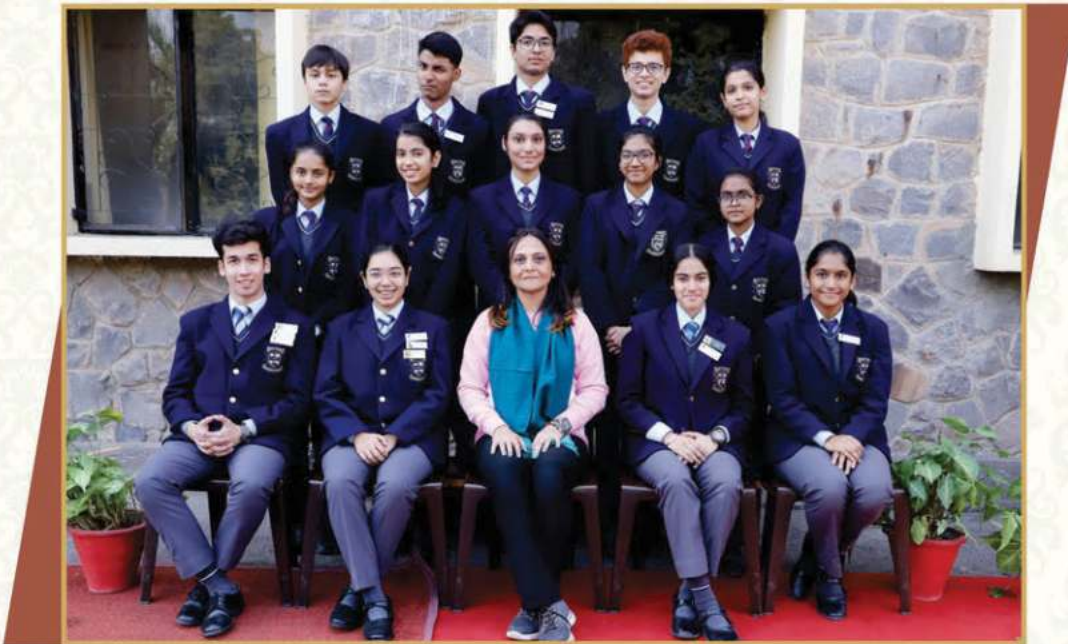

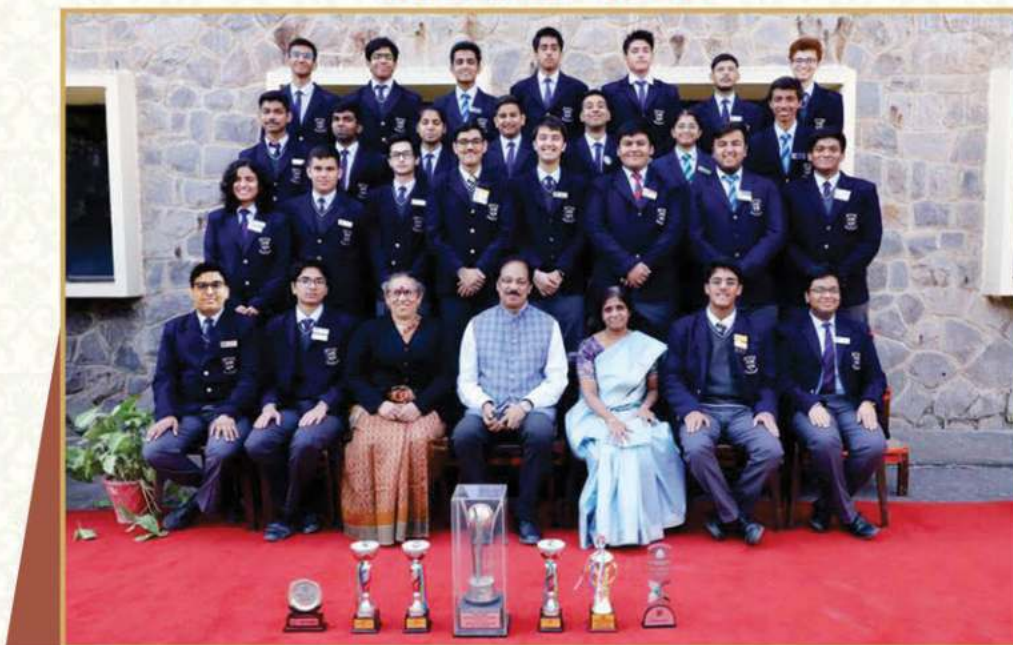

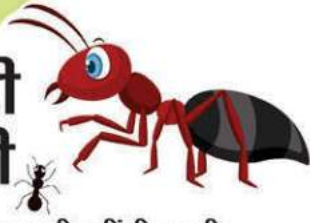
